

# *Bobbles on a Knitting Loom*

Bobbles are used to add texture to a knitted item. Usually you will see them in knitted items that have cables. The method below was derived by studying the mini-bobbles created with needles.

1. Reach the peg/stitch where you want your bobble to be.
2. Knit on that peg 5 times. (Knit peg once, \*e-wrap the peg, knit over; rep from \* to 3 more times)
3. Take the last stitch knitted off the peg and hold it with your knitting tool. Hold the stitch up, above the knitting tool.
4. Reach down and bring back to the peg the very first stitch that was on the peg. (The 5 stitches knitted will be to the front of the peg)
5. Place the loop being held on the tool back on the peg. Peg has now 2 loops.
6. Knit over by reaching through the side of the peg.

A small bobble was just created. The bobble should be to the front of the knitting, if your bobble is inside out—meaning the bobble is poking through the wrong side of the item, simply push it towards the front.

**Tip:** To make your knitted item more interesting, you can knit your bobbles with a different color.

How: When you reach the place where you want your bobble, drop the main color of yarn, join a contrasting color and knit the bobble instructions with the secondary color. After bobble is complete, cut the secondary color leaving a 5 inch tail. Pick up the main color and continue knitting.
